

Today's Meeting - August 1, 2019

Marlborough Community Development Authority Director Vonnie Morris reported on the current state of public housing in the City

ith a background in real estate, Vonnie Morris serves as the Director of Marlborough Community Development Authority (MCDA) and Marlborough Housing Authority. With offices in the Walker Building, the work of this agency is

income based. It includes Community Development Block Grants, Critical Home Repair Loans, Elderly Housing and more.

The Mission of the Marlborough Community Development Authority is to strive to preserve the city's existing housing stock, support the development of new housing opportunities targeting low income families, and improve and preserve the existing properties and their landscape.

One current grant of \$40,000 sponsors a Boy Scout project to educate teens about the opioid program.

The Critical Home Repair Loans save family homes from spiraling into disrepair. Such improvements stabilize families, as they are not available for income properties.

These programs put money back into the community where it can do the most good.

The Marlborough Housing Authority administers four primary affordable housing programs:

- Senior Public Housing: 227 units within 3 public housing communities (240 Main Street; 29 Pleasant Street; and 397 Bolton Street), of which 31 units are reserved for non-elderly disabled per the regulations set forth by the Massachusetts Department of Housing & Urban Development (DHCD). Academy Knoll is no longer under local control. Currently, they are in a rebuilding process of the Pleasant Street property through a grant. The building at 240 Main Street needs a new roof, which will cost \$800,000, and they are applying for grants to do that.
- HUD Section 8 Portable Vouchers: The MCDA administers 128 U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) Section 8 potable vouchers.
- Massachusetts Vouchers: The MCDA administers AHVP and DMH vouchers as they are made available.
- Special Needs Housing: The Housing Division owns a property for disabled individuals with 11 units that is managed by <u>the Advocates</u>.

There is a waiting list for Section 8 housing is 8 to 9 years long! Applicants may apply online. There is a preference for local residents, veterans and/or spouses of veterans, and of course, those in an emergency situation go to the top of the waiting list. The list is centralized covering all of Massachusetts. Everything uis done by mail. Individuals are given 10 days to respond to request a hearing.

HUD issues vouchers. Marlborough is issued 135 vouchers and the number stays the same as costs increase. Respectfully submitted Pegaie Thorsen
