Amy Schram told the club about the myriad of information available from the Better Business Bureau

my Schram is the Community Relations Manager for the Better Business Bureau (BBB), serving Eastern Massachusetts, Maine, Rhode Island, and Vermont. The BBB's Vision is an ethical marketplace where buyers and sellers trust each other. It was founded in 1912.

Amy makes 150 to 300 presentations to community groups every year. The most requested program by these groups is about scams.

The BBB monitors advertisements — mostly online. When needed, they contact the advertiser to "improve" their copy. It has evolved since it is mostly used after the need to facilitate a consumer complaint. Their office handles over 20,000 phone inquiries per year. In 2018, they recorded 23,000 inquiries, and they have already had 20,000 inquiries so far this year.



A great deal of information can be found on <u>www.BBB.org</u>. The phone is answered from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Many inquiries concern charitable organizations. The website has a "scam alerts" area as well as a "Scam Tracker." These reports are shared with the Federal Trade Commission. In 2018, over 50,000 scams were reported.

There is also a Small Business Help Center. There are 420,000 accredited businesses. To be accredited, a business must be doing business for at least six months and adhere to the BBB's eight standards of trust. The BBB has rated 5.5 million business profiles from "A" to "F." These ratings allow consumers to make informed decisions.

Amy Schramm of the Better Business Bureau address the Marlborough Rotary Club.

If a business drops to a "B" grade, its accreditation is revoked. The customer review section does not affect accreditation. Complaints affect accreditation. Research for accreditation is done through government entities — offices of Attorneys -General and/or offices of consumer protection in the home states of the business.

Collaboration with Google makes sure to update business profiles while they also make sure that the Google data is accurate.

The cost for a business to be on the BBB website is based on the number of employees in that business. In turn, the business gets a free website, videos and design services. The BBB has a state-of-theart facility that works with businesses in five states.
